### **Drug-Free Schools & Communities Information**

To comply with the Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act of 1989 and the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988, the following information is provided to currently enrolled and prospective students, as well as parents, community residents and employees of the Southern West Virginia Community and Technical College.

Substance abuse and drug dependency are problems of staggering proportions in our society today. The unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession, or use of illicit drugs and alcohol on Southern West Virginia Community and Technical College property individually or as a part of any college sponsored function is prohibited. Reporting to work, class, or any college sponsored function under the influence of alcohol or illicit drugs is prohibited. Disciplinary sanctions consistent with local, state, and federal laws for violation of the standards of conduct will be imposed. All persons should be aware that violations could result in expulsion from the college, termination of employment, or referral for prosecution. ### **Military Selective Service Compliance**

State law provides that a male person who has attained the age of eighteen (18) years may not enroll in a state-supported institution of postsecondary education unless he is in compliance with the Military Selective Service Act (50 U. S. Code, Appendix §451, et seq. and the amendments thereto). Also, a male person may not receive a loan, grant, scholarship, or other financial assistance for postsecondary higher education funded by state revenue, including federal funds or gifts and grants accepted by this State, or receive a student loan guaranteed by the State unless he is in compliance with the Military Selective Service Act.

### **Tuition Rates**

Tuition rates for the 2005/2006 academic year have not been approved by the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education as of press time. Please call the business office at any campus location to verify tuition rates for the 2005/2006 academic year.

### **Payment Plans**

Southern West Virginia Community and Technical College accepts cash, checks, Visa, and MasterCard for payment. The College also offers an installment payment plan. This plan is designed for students who prefer to divide the payment of their tuition. For additional information, please contact the College's Business Office at any campus location.

### **Refund of Tuition and Fees Effective August, 1992**

#### **Eligibility for Refunds**

To be eligible for a refund, a student must completely withdraw from the institution by completing an official withdrawal form, having it signed and dated by each affected instructor, and presenting it to the Student Records Office. Official withdrawal for a returning student shall become effective on the date that written notification of intent to withdraw is received by the Student Records Office. Refunds for first-time enrollees shall be calculated on the refund period in which the student last attended class. College withdrawal forms must be presented in person by the student or an authorized representative. The withdrawal process is not complete until the student or authorized representative presents the completed withdrawal form that has been signed by Student Records Office personnel to the campus business office.

Those identified as being eligible to receive refunds of tuition and fees are those students who withdraw from all courses for which they have registered, leaving the student with zero hours attempted for that semester or term. Students who withdraw from course(s), but who have at least one credit hour class remaining, shall be ineligible to receive a refund. The policy herein stated shall not apply to courses canceled by the institution nor to withdrawals processed prior to the first day of regularly scheduled classes for any semester or term.

Should the percentage calculation identify a particular day, the entire day should be included in the higher education refund period. Classes operating on a non-traditional academic calendar (i.e. mini-courses, 8 weeks courses, etc.) have a different refund calendar. Students affected by these courses must contact the Registrar's office. All refunds are to be calculated from the first day of classes of a given semester or term. Every student who registers incurs a financial obligation to the college. Refund checks are normally mailed within fifteen days of the official withdrawal date. Refunded fees must be returned in accordance with the requirements of the Higher Education Act whenever Title IV funds are involved.

A withdrawal fee may be charged by the institution not to exceed five percent (5%) of the total student fees charged for the term or one hundred dollars (\$100.00) , whichever is less.

Exceptions to this policy resulting from extenuating circumstances must be approved by the Vice President for Student Affairs or his/her designee before a refund may be processed. The decision of the Vice President for Student Affairs may be appealed through an appropriate appeal process.

In accordance with recent trends towards the recognition of non-traditional learning experience, Southern offers students the opportunity to get a head start in college. College credit may be awarded for knowledge gained through:

- Advanced Placement Examinations
- College Level Examination Program (CLEP)
- Challenging a Course/Credit by Examination
- Credit by Experience (Life Experiences Assessment Program - LEAP)
- Correspondence Course Credit
- Military Service
- Vocational/Technical School Articulation of Credit

### **Severe Weather Information**

Southern West Virginia Community and Technical College operates on the premise that classes will be held on a regularly scheduled basis whenever possible. In the event of severe weather conditions or emergencies, the safety and well-being of students and employees is of utmost importance. Local broadcast media will be notified as soon as a decision is made should classes need to be delayed or canceled. ### **Assessment Expectations for Students**

All students enrolling in certificate and associate degree programs are expected to participate in institutional, program, course and/or services assessment activities. This participation will most often be in the form of tests to determine the degree of student academic achievement within the basic skills, the general education core curriculum, or the academic major. As part of the academic calendar, "testing days" will be established during which students will be required to participate in these assessment activities. Participation is an expectation of students as a condition of their continuation in the academic program of study and as a prerequisite to graduation. Assessment activities include entrance assessment for course placement, mid-point assessment to determine academic progress, and exit assessment prior to program completion and graduation. Failure to participate in scheduled assessment activities may result in limitations on continued enrollment, forwarding of official transcripts, and/or program completion and graduation.

### **Placement Standards Required for College Courses\*\***

Standards for the assessment and placement of students in college level courses have been adopted by the Governing Board and Southern West Virginia Community and Technical College. In compliance with these standards, students at Southern West Virginia Community and Technical College must meet the minimum score on one of the following placement exams before enrolling in college level (100 level or higher) courses. Students not meeting the minimum scores are required to successfully complete developmental courses in the subject area of deficiency prior to registering for college level courses. Placement instruments and minimum required scores are:

#### **English**

1. Enhanced ACT - a score of 18 or above on the English section.
2. ACCUPLACER - a score of 88 or above on the Sentence Skills test.

#### **Reading**

1. Enhanced ACT - a score of 17 or above on the Reading section.
2. ACCUPLACER - a score of 79 or above on the Reading Comprehension test.

### **Mathematics**

1. Enhanced ACT - a score of 19 or above on the Mathematics section.
2. ACCUPLACER - a score of 85 or above on the Arithmetic test **and** a score of 84 or above on the Elementary Algebra test.

Scores used for placement purposes must come from a single assessment instrument; for example, if the Enhanced ACT is used for placement in English, it must also be used for determining scores for placement in Math. The waiting period for retesting is at the discretion of the institution and may vary for each assessment instrument. For students who have previously taken ASSET, placement using scores on this instrument may be considered on a case-by-case basis. Please refer to the college catalog for test scores minimums and/or prerequisites for specific courses.

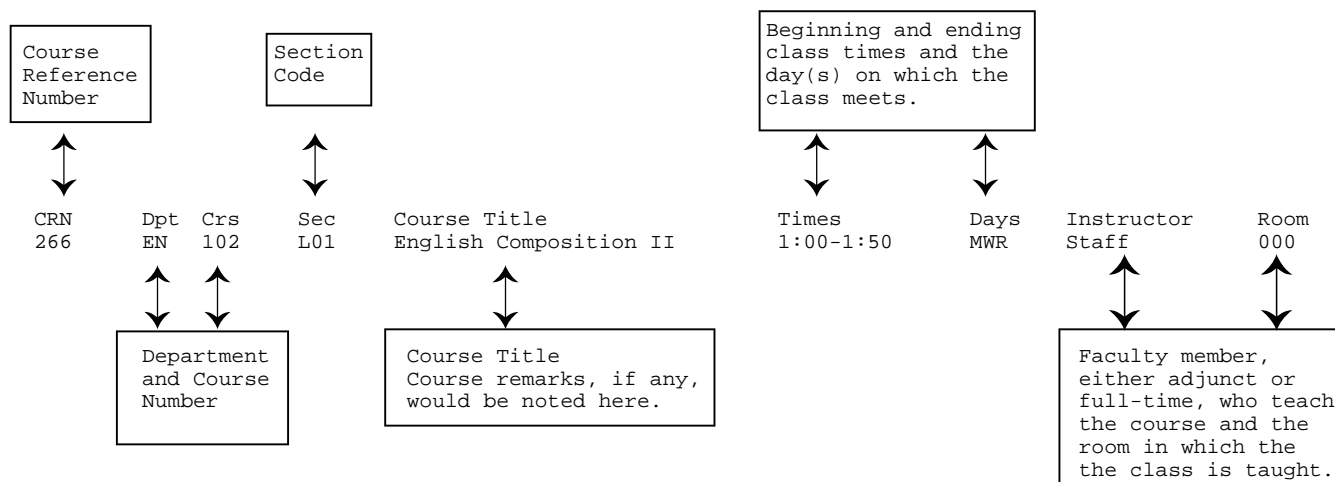

**\*Distance Learning Opportunities:**

- CRS - Students will complete readings at home and mail in assignments. Some correspondence courses may require students to come to campus for mandatory meetings during the semester.
- HEITV - HEITV (Higher Education Instructional Television) courses are broadcast over West Virginia Public Broadcasting stations. On-campus mandatory meetings occur periodically during the semester.
- ICR - ICR classrooms are fitted with technology that allows sessions at one campus to be transmitted to any other campus or branch campus. Students can view the session, see demonstrations, ask and respond to questions, and communicate with all other locations.
- WEB - Students attend class and complete course assignments via the Internet. Web browsing ability and e-mail proficiency are minimal requirements. Communication between the student and the instructor occurs through e-mail or chat room sessions. Some courses may require visits to campus.

**Program Admission:** In addition to the general admission requirements of Southern, students applying for admission to certain programs (i.e. - nursing, information technology, MLT, etc.) must comply with program specific entrance requirements. Please consult the college catalog or your advisor for more information.

**CTCS-KTCS-Southern Online (WEB) Courses**

The Community and Technical College System of West Virginia (CTCS) and the Kentucky Community and Technical College System (KTCS) have entered into a joint agreement to provide access to online courses for West Virginia college students.

## Registration Process

The student should:

- obtain the proper catalog. The catalog details the courses in the program and the recommended program sequence.

A new student will be admitted under the catalog in force at the time of initial enrollment. A returning student should consult with his/her advisor to ensure that the proper catalog is used in determining their course selection.

- obtain the schedule of classes for the semester for which he/she wishes to register.
- review the schedule of classes and the college catalog before seeing an advisor. A sample registration form is included in the schedule of classes.

Once the student has reviewed the schedule and catalog he/she should see an advisor. The advisor will assist the student in selecting the appropriate courses. Factors such as the desired program area, courses already completed, course sequencing, family, work, and other responsibilities may affect course selection.

- obtain a printed copy of his/her schedule after the advisor has entered it into the computer.
- feel free to request assistance with financial aid, disability services, career counseling, tutoring, etc.
- arrange for tuition payment with the business office. Southern offers several tuition payment plans.
